

The AAEE Winter School is an immersive experience that brings together engineering education researchers, hosted at UTS from 18 – 22 July.

Attendees will learn about:

- Designing and undertaking effective education research projects
- Evaluating teaching and curriculum
- Positioning evaluation and research activities considering current trends
- Appreciating and responding to national and local grant opportunities
- Building collaborative research partnerships across Australia and beyond

Fees for the week (including instruction, materials, and morning and afternoon teas) are:

- \$AU400 for PhD students (who are not full-time academics)
- \$AU700 for academic staff members of AAEE
- \$AU800 for academic staff non-members of AAEE

Daily registration for returning participants on Thursday and/or Friday costs:

- \$AU50 for PhD students (who are not full-time academics)
- \$AU100 for academic staff

If you are travelling and the direct flight time from the city/town where you work, to Sydney is more than two hours there will be a \$AU100 reduction in registration fees to assist with flight costs.

We are delighted to share that Dr Andrea Goncher will join the Editorial Team of the Australasian Journal of Engineering Education as an Associate Editor. Dr Goncher has been serving as an Advisory Committee Member of Journal.

Dr Goncher is an Instructional Assistant Professor at the University of Florida (USA) in the Department of Engineering Education. She has held postdoctoral and faculty positions at Queensland University of Technology and Charles Sturt University.

Dr. Goncher's research interests include international engineering education with approaches to facilitate student development through design thinking and human-centered engineering. She has worked with Engineers Without Borders- Australia and Unbound, to provide students immersive learning experiences in humanitarian engineering. Dr. Goncher teaches first-year and capstone design courses and elements of electrical engineering. She integrates her teaching and research practices by using machine learning to improve conceptual understanding and personalize learning.

Dr. Goncher is an honors graduate of Duquesne University, where she earned her BS in Physics. She was awarded a Master of Science in Industrial Engineering from the University of Pittsburgh and received her Ph.D. in Engineering Education from Virginia Tech.
