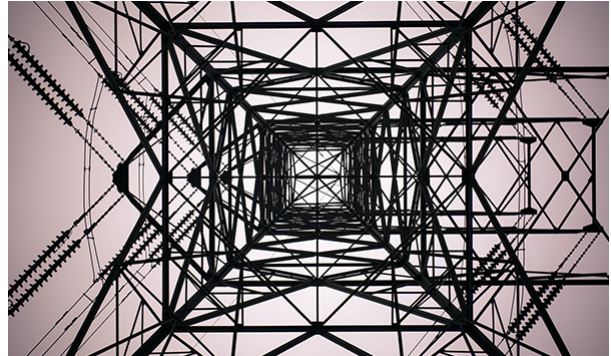

The deadline for paper submissions has been extended to Monday 15 August. All submissions will be double blind peer reviewed following AAEE's review process. You will be notified of acceptance of your paper by Friday 26 August 2022.

Call for applications for the 2022 AAEE grants

We are looking for projects in line with recommendations from Australian Council of Engineering Deans (ACED) 'Engineering Futures 2035: A scoping study (Crosthwaite, 2019)', either within an engineering discipline or across disciplines.

The ACED scoping study explores the knowledge, skills and attributes of professional engineers required to meet anticipated changes to engineering work in Australia by the year 2035. It explores potential approaches to engineering education and makes recommendations for further detailed investigation. Up to two projects will be funded to address the outcomes of the ACED scoping study to a maximum of \$20,000 per project.

AAEE is also keen to support project(s) that are aligned to Australian Collaborative Education Network Limited (ACEN). ACEN is the professional association for practitioners and researchers from the tertiary education sector, industry, community and government representatives. They are involved in work integrated learning in Australia. ACEN provides strategic leadership for work-integrated learning research, scholarship and practice in Australia, for its members and other stakeholders. One project aligned with the priorities of ACEN will be funded to a maximum of \$10,000.

- Head of Credentials Development, Rob Jarman – this role includes progressing an Engineers Australia program endorsement framework. This will enable micro-credentials, short courses and postgraduate courses (grad cert, grad dip, extension masters etc) to be evaluated and endorsed by the professional body.
