2025 AAEE Engineering Education Grants

The **2025 AAEE Engineering Education Grants** are open for application! There are **3 grants of up to \$10,000** each available to projects which address the outcomes of the ACED Engineering Futures 2035.

The grants encourage excellence in scholarly practice and/or research specific to **Engineering Education** in higher education or equivalent by supporting teams who possess the desired mix of demonstratable expertise and skills and/or are emerging leaders in the field to:

- 1. Identify engineering educational issues across the higher education system and to facilitate approaches to address these issues.
- 2. Devise and undertake a programme of activities that will have positive impact on engineering students, staff, and/or institutions.
- 3. Raise the profile of engineering education in higher education and the prestige associated with the pursuit of scholarly excellence and/or research.
- 4. Show leadership in promoting and enhancing engineering education in higher education and exploring new possibilities.
- 5. Establish and build on national and international partnerships in engineering education in higher education or equivalent.
- 6. Foster national collaboration and collegial networking for sharing research, innovation and good practice in engineering education.
- 7. Contribute to the growing community of engineering education scholars in higher education or equivalent.

The AAEE Engineering Education Grants nomination instructions provide information for nominees and their home institutions. Announcement of Engineering Studies Paper Prize for 2025

The field of engineering studies is a diverse, interdisciplinary arena of scholarly research.

The prize celebrates an excellent refereed journal paper or book chapter addressing the relationships among the technical, social and philosophical dimensions of engineering practices, and how these relationships change over time and from place to place.

This year, the prize committee is calling for articles published in 2024 or 2025 in media *other than* the Engineering Studies journal. Next year, the committee will call for articles published in the Engineering Studies journal in 2025 or 2026.

Nominations can be submitted by any INES member.

Nominations will be judged by an Awards Committee made up of INES board members and distinguished scholars to reflect the international and interdisciplinary nature of the Network.

Some of the criteria that the award committee will consider include:

- Inspiring and relevant research problem
- Significant contribution to the field
- Outstanding use—and possibly development—of relevant theory
- Exemplary use of appropriate research methods
- Potential for transforming the field

August CREITE meeting

August CREITE session Wed 20th 1230-2pm - Alternative approaches to interviewing

The Centre for Research into Engineering and Information Technology Education (CREITE) holds monthly meetings exploring topical issues and the latest research in engineering education. Activities include guest speakers discussing EER methodologies or research projects; peer feedback sessions on draft abstracts or conference presentations, and interactive sessions on different skills and approaches in EER (e.g. reviewing journal manuscripts). CREITE is hosted by the University of Technology Sydney, with members from the Sydney region and beyond, including the University of New South Wales, University of Newcastle, and Charles Sturt University. We normally meet on the third Wednesday of the month, from 1230-2pm, Feb-Nov.

Our next CREITE session is planned for Wednesday August 20, 12:30-2 (as always lunchtime on the third Wednesday of each month, February to November). This session we'll be focusing on alternative approaches to interviewing.

Why are we doing this and what do we hope you'll get out of it?

Interviewing is a very commonly used data collection technique. In this session we want to push back the dimensions of what's possible in interviews. We hope you'll leave the session with some new ideas about how you might approach interviews in innovative ways.

What is it?

In this session we will hear from three guest speakers who have incorporated diverse approaches in their research interviews:

- Dr Karen Whelan on insider/outsider perspectives
- Dr Wengian Gan on narrative interviews
- Dr Deborah Nixon on photo-elicitation

Each speaker will give a brief synopsis of their approach before we open up for discussion.
